Wed., Apr. 2: Hume, *Enquiry*, §§I and II.

Mon., Apr. 7: Hume, *Enquiry*, §§III and IV.

Wed., Apr. 9: Hume, *Enquiry*, §§ V and IX.

Mon., Apr. 14: Kant, *Groundwork*, Preface and sect. 1.

Wed., Apr. 16: Kant, *Groundwork*, sect. 2, pp. 22–40, end of no. 4 (Ak. 406–near end of Ak. 423) (ending “of all the hope of the assistance that he wishes for himself”).

Mon., Apr. 21: Kant, *Groundwork*, sect. 2, pp. 40–55, end of first paragraph (Ak. 423–beginning of Ak. 437) (ending “as far as may be done, to bring the action nearer to intuition”).

Wed., Apr. 23: **no class** (seventh day of Passover).

Fri., Apr. 25: Kant, *Groundwork*, sect. 2, pp. 55–8, until just before the heading “Autonomy of the will” (Ak. 437–40) (ending “itself subject to this legislation”); sect. 3, pp. 63–71, through the end of the subsection titled “How is a categorical imperative possible?” (Ak. 446–55).

Mon., Apr. 28: Kant, *Critique of Pure Reason* and *Critique of Practical Reason* (short selections) (a total of about eight pages, but, warning, very rough going).

Wed., Apr. 30: Emerson, “Self-Reliance” (in your book).

Mon., May 5: Emerson, “History” (in your book); “Circles” (handout) (and **first paper due**).

Wed., May 7: Nietzsche, “On the Uses and Disadvantages of History for Life,” Foreword and §§1–3, 5–6 (*Untimely Meditations*, pp. 59–77 and 83–95).

Mon., May 12: Nietzsche, “Schopenhauer as Educator” §§1–2 (pp. 127–36); §§4–5 (pp. 146–161); from §6, the description of the scholar (p. 169, 2nd par.—beginning “Science is related to wisdom”—through p. 174, 2nd par.—ending “cannot be found in him either.”); §8 (pp. 182–94).

Mon., June 2: Wolfe, *Sword and Citadel*, pp. 9–68, 197–200 (from *The Sword of the Lictor*); 205–228, 239–243, 255–259, 272–top half of 274, 321–340 (except for bottom two lines) (from *The Citadel of the Autarch*).
