## **Course Requirements**

Due dates are indicated in the attached Schedule of Readings and Assignments.

- (1) Submission of three short papers. The first paper will be slightly shorter and represent 10% of the final grade. The second and third papers each represent one third (33%) of the final grade. If an extension is required, it must be requested before the due date. Late papers or those exceeding the word limits indicated will be marked down.
- (2) Submission on Monday or Wednesday of each week of a *brief* (i.e., 200-word) critical commentary (or question) on the reading assignment for that day, due in class. We meet for ten weeks and your nine best commentaries will count toward your grade. Commentaries will be marked 0 to 3 depending on quality, with a 2 being the expected grade on each. These commentaries in conjunction with contribution to class discussion constitute the remaining quarter (23%) of the final grade.
- (3) Participation in class discussion of the readings. Quality and appropriateness of comments will be valued over quantity.
