

## Bibliography

This list of references is partial and eclectic. It is designed to provide you with starting points in a vast and widely ranging literature. Included are classic as well as more recent treatments of "Early Modern" Spanish colonialism in North and Meso-America. In addition to works cited below, several serial publications contain numerous relevant papers and monographs. These include: *Ethnohistory*, *Historical Archaeology*, *Iberoamericana* (monographs in journal form published by UC Press, Berkeley between the 1920s and 1960s), *Hispanic American Historical Review*, *The Americas*, *New Mexico Historical Review*, *Florida Anthropology*, *Florida Archaeology*, and *Colonial Latin American Historical Review*. In addition, most titles in the *Spanish Borderlands Sourcebooks* series (27 vols.) published by Garland Press, New York, under the general editorship of D.H. Thomas are directly relevant. The latter are compilations of previously published articles and documents on "Borderlands" archaeology and history. Individual volumes vary tremendously in quality and evenness. The *Columbian Consequences* volumes, again published under the editorship of D.H. Thomas, are very important sources for this course. These volumes, published between 1989 and 1991 by the Smithsonian Institution Press in Washington D.C., are the result of SAA symposia organized around the Columbian Quincentenary.
