<b>Job Market Paper</b>	“ <b>A Resurrection of the Condorcet Jury Theorem</b> ” (Joint with Balázs Szentes) <u>Abstract:</u> This paper analyzes the optimal size of a deliberating committee where, (i) there is no conflict of interest among individuals, and (ii) information acquisition is costly. The committee members simultaneously decide whether or not to acquire information, and then, they make the ex-post efficient decision. The optimal committee size, $k^*$ , is shown to be bounded. The main result of this paper is that any arbitrarily large committee aggregates the decentralized information more efficiently than the committee of size $k^*-2$ . This result implies that oversized committees generate only small inefficiencies.
